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I. Introduction

On Thursday November 8, 2020 in the framework of the Erasmus Plus programme for Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education (CBHE) project 598661-EPP-1-2018-1-RO-EPPKA2-CBHE-JP Developing services for Individuals with Disabilities. [DECIDE] the Khujand State University, Kulob institute of Technology and Management, Public institution of the civil Service under the President of the Republic of Tajikistan and Parents Association with Disabilities in a corporation with Government of Tajikistan (GoT), UNICEF and sister UN agencies, as well as civil society partners will be launching a National Awareness Day campaign to promote respect for the rights and dignity of children, women and men with disabilities, and to challenge prevailing misconceptions and reduce stigma about disability.





I. Introduction

The overall aim of this initiative is to create a more inclusive society with opportunity for all. In the lunch event we are planning to host representatives of the Ministry of Health and Social Protection of the Population, Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Tajikistan, the UN Resident Coordinator, UNICEF Representative in Tajikistan and others.

In the next weeks and months, various media materials produced under the framework of this campaign, such as TV and radio talk-shows and short animation movies, will reach the wider community in Tajikistan through local media and community mobilization efforts.






Infrastructure of the University






Location

FOCUS GROUPS IN NATIONAL AWARENESS DAY

Tajik DECIDE teammate are running a focus group in a couple weeks. The group will be about 10-12 people and we cover about 12 group. We'd like to add a few interactive elements to this focus group so that people have a variety of ways to express themselves, move around, and have some fun. Here's our running list for

activities to use during interactive focus groups.





Hold Small Group Discussions

Give each small group a discussion prompt, give them time to discuss that question, and then ask the small groups to share a key observation or two back with the larger group.





FOCUS GROUPS IN NATIONAL AWARENESS DAY

Vote with Stickers

Ask focus group attendees to show where they stand on issues by putting a colored sticker on a large sheet of paper. We used this technique in a community forum and asked residents to vote and indicate their priority areas for the disabilities. For example, people placed stickers beside their top areas, like education, rights, services of disabilities and more.




Begin with a Survey

We can start with a brief survey about some questions about education, rights, services of disabilities.







Free-Writing Exercise

Start with a free-writing exercise "to help participants access relevant memory. Jumpstart a rich discussion by asking them to share what they wrote with one another."

Use Roundtable Ranking

Small groups rapidly brainstorm the strengths and weaknesses of the project on a single sheet of paper and rank-order (1, 2, 3) the strengths and weaknesses.







Use an Interview Design Process

The Interview Design Process is a hybrid of a focus group and a speed dating session.

Build a Community Map

Community map in the center where we will use internal evaluator. The people help us to collect data about disability's problem in their community and mapped the data using density maps and little pins and flags. The data was part of their needs assessment, and then the next step will be to develop messaging or booklets or reports for organization, communities.
